You need to pack your equipment yourself, do not let your parents or guardians do it. By packing the equipment yourself you will know exactly what you have and where it is packed.

It is vital that all kit is packed so it is thoroughly waterproof. Use bin liners and plenty of plastic bags. It is very important that you have enough bedding to remain warm at night and that it is kept dry. It is also very important to have and wear a waterproof jacket and outer trousers so your other clothes remain dry. You will be unable to attend Camp without these items.

- Full Scouts Uniform
- 4 Warm sweaters, jumper or sweatshirts
- 2 x T-shirt or similar
- 2 x Trousers
- 2 x Spare underclothes
- 4 x Spare pair of socks
- Nightwear
- Waterproof jacket and trousers^(A)
- Waterproof boots/strong watertight shoes^(B)
- Personal washing requirements and towel
- Scarf, hat and gloves
- Sleeping Bag
- Extra Sleeping Bag/Blankets
- Foam roll / roll mat
- Torch and spare batteries
- Personal first aid kit
- Spare trainers/shoes
- Plastic bags (for dirty clothes)

The following items are not allowed on the event and should not be packed:

- Mobile phones^(C)
- MP3 players and personal stereos
- Electronic gadgets that can be broken
- Personal televisions
- Knives
- Personal games consoles (such as PSPs etc)
- Jewellery (exc. Watches)
- All other electrical equipment (exc. Torches)
- Aerosol cans
- Fire lighting instruments

- A. A waterproof coat is required in case of wet weather. A non-waterproof coat will become soaked within a few minutes of a shower.
- B. Walking boots/waterproof shoes are recommended. Wellington boots also keep your feet dry in very wet weather.
- C. Mobile phones are not allowed at Camp. If your parents/guardians need to contact you in an emergency, they will do so via the home contact. This is an independent individual who will pass their message onto the Camp Leaders who will inform you. The home contact is also responsible for delivering a message to parents from the Camp Leader, should the Camp Leader need to get in contact.
